



Sheafs of Rainbows: Amy Lowell on Life, Poetry, and Other Stained Glass Windows Presented by El Camino College Adjunct English Instructor, Kathryn Hall

For decades, Amy Lowell, daughter of one of the wealthiest families in America was searching for direction in her life. In 1912, she found it with the publication of her first book of poetry A Dome of Many-Colored Glass. From that moment on , she was determined to cut away the influence of English Victorianism on the nation's literary landscape and plant it with a modern, wholly American style.



Progressivism and the 1912 Presidential Election Presented by El Camino College History Professor, Dr. Michael James Eula

The Progressive Movement (1890-1918) emerged during a period in American history of tremendous economic and demographic change including the advent of the industrial age and an influx of immigrants arriving in the United States that introduced new political traditions and an emergent capitalist class. These new capitalist industrial barons were perceived by "Progressives" as a threat to American life and traditional values of individual achievement and Republican government. The 1912 presidential election marked the birth of the Progressive Party and a call for a "New Nationalism" based on progressive reform.



The Zane Grey Influence on the Early Film Industry Presenter To Be Announced.

The failed baseball player turned dentist had been struggling for ten years to transform himself into a popular writer. Then in 1912, he published a novel that would make him a household name and would become the archetype of Western story telling ultimately fueling a



whole new industry in film making.
