

DVC has a wonderful Art Gallery with Arthur King at the helm.



Expanding Your Horizons

Community Education was delighted to host the annual Expanding Your Horizons STEM conference for middle school girls. We had 86 girls and 10, hands-on, STEM workshops. Workshops were mostly led by DVC faculty and included:

- Crime Scene Investigation
- GIS Technology
- Jewelry-Making with Chemistry

3D Computer Modeling & Printing

Community Education owns 3D printers and has offered 3D computer modeling & 3D printing classes for youth.

Three, one-day, classes have been offered so far with a total of 57 students enrolled. Over the past two summers, over 200 students, grades 6th - 9th, have participated in this class through CFK.

Introduction to MATLab & 3D Plotting



Twenty-seven, 6th - 8th grade students enjoyed a one-day class on MATLab, a software used in Artificial Intelligence and Aerospace. This is a great example of taking a software already installed on DVC computers and making it available to youth to gain a better understanding of skills needed to compete in an everchanging technological world.





Teaching the Next

Four, unique, magazines have been published over the past two summers with a total of 32 journalist students.






